Listen and read

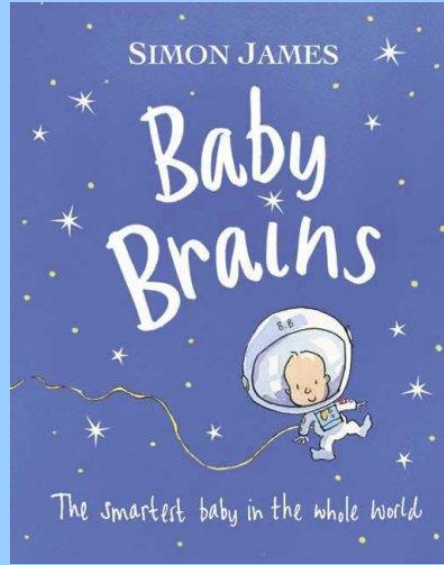
- Listen to the story on Vimeo. Tricky words will be explained there too. Link: <https://vimeo.com/412006978>
- Read the copy of the story with your family.

Get to know the story

- Which was your favourite part? Why?
- Make a TRUE/FALSE quiz about the story for your family.
- Is Baby Brains a good title for the book? Think of three other titles that would be good too – why?
- Make a fact file about Baby Brains.
- **Hot Seat** the characters. One person pretends to be a character and the others ask them questions.

Writing

- Write the story in your own words. Draw pictures to go with it.
- Write the story but change the things that Baby Brains does.
- What job would you like to do? Draw a picture and write about what you would do.
- Write a letter to Baby Brains to give him some advice. You might want to tell him about the things ordinary babies enjoy doing.
- Pretend to be Baby Brains. Write a diary about your adventures. Remember to describe what you did and say how you felt.
- Pretend to be Baby Brain's teacher. Write his school report.



History

- Find out about yourself as a baby. Look at some photos. What things did you like to do?
- Interview your parents or carers. Ask them what it was like when they were children. Think of some questions before you start. Here are some ideas. Where did they live? What was their family like? Did they have any pets? Who were their friends? What did they wear? What food did they like? What toys did they play with? What books did they like? What did they enjoy doing at school?
- If you can talk to your grandparents or another older relative or friend of your family, ask them the questions too. Compare everyone's answers. How have things changed?

Science and PSCHE

- Think about how humans change through the stages of life – baby, child, teenager, adult., old age. What do they look like? What can they do? Make fact files or Top Trumps for each stage.
- Find out about different baby animals. What are they called? How do their parents care for them?
- Find out about the life cycles of animals. Draw the life cycle of a butterfly or frog.
- What do all living things need to survive? What do humans need for physical and mental well-being? Make posters.

Art and DT

- Make stars and a moon out of paper or card. Hang them up to make it feel like you are in space. Make yourself a space helmet out of a cereal box and an oxygen tank out of a plastic bottle. Take a photo of yourself pretending to do a space walk.
- Design yourself a costume to go with a job you would like to do.
