## Listen and read

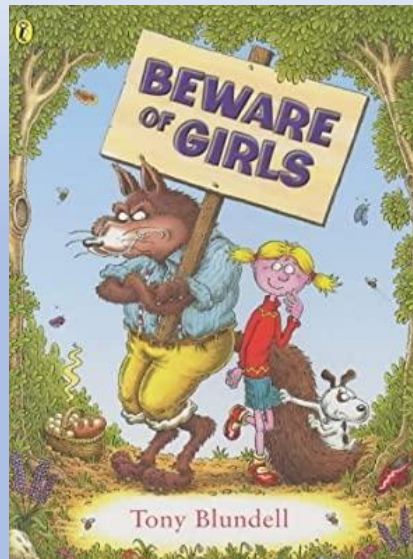
- Listen to the story on Vimeo. Tricky words will be explained there too.

- Read the copy of the story with your family.
- If you are talking to friends and relatives on line or on the phone, read them the story.

## Get to know the story

- Make a TRUE/FALSE quiz about the story for your family.
- Make a text map (the story in pictures) of your favourite part of the story. Learn it off by heart with actions.
- Divide a sheet of paper into four equal parts using a pencil and ruler. First box - name of book and author. Second box - name of characters. Third box - main idea or summary. Fourth box - your favourite part - write a summary.
- Design a new cover for the book. What pictures would give hints about the story? Write a new blurb for the back.
- Design a t-shirt for one of the characters - think about what they are like. What pictures or words would they have on the t-shirt?
- Compare this wolf with the wolf from Mr Wolf's Pancakes. How are they the same? How are they different?

### Drama

- **Act out the story with your family.** If there aren't enough of you, take on several parts or act it out with toys. Make some puppets and put on a show.
- **Hot Seat** some characters. One person pretends to be a character and the others ask them questions.
- **Mirror, Mirror.** Two people face each other. One person chooses a character, moves like the character and makes facial expressions like the character. The other person copies them exactly, as though they are the character in the mirror.



## Art and DT

- Draw a scene in the story. Draw Rexy on a separate piece of paper and put him on a strip of card. Make a slit in the scene. Slot Rexy through so he pops out from behind a tree or a bush.
- Create a disguise for the wolf.
- Make some trifle.
- How else could you get rid of the wolf? Design a trap or another way of getting him away from the little girl's house.

## Science

- Real wolves are fascinating creatures. Find out about them. Where do they live? What do they eat? How do they behave?

## Writing

Remember to write in sentences so your writing is clear and easy to understand.

- Write a list of things that you would like the wolf to bring you.
- Make a comic strip of the story.
- Turn the story into a play script.
- Pretend you are one of the characters in the book. Who will you be? Write your diary for one day in the story.
- Write a letter to the wolf telling him what other characters think of him. Give him some advice.
- Write another book in the series – Beware of ..... you decide.
